ALL DAY: CULTURAL EVENTS Visits of Ancient Synagogues in Provence

Paul Kahle and Gérard Weil are two eminent specialists who had and continue to have a profound impact on biblical and Masoretic studies. Since Kahle's discovery in 1926 of the first complete manuscript of the Hebrew Bible ever preserved (the "Leningrad Codex") and Weil's work in the 1960s and 1970s, there has been a growing number of questions about the origin of the biblical text and its medieval transmission, while editions of the Bible have been substantially updated.

In November 2016, Weil's private document and archive collection was bequeathed to the BIAA (MMSH) as the ANR project Manuscripta Bibliae Hebraicae (led by Élodie Attia) began working systematically on the form, function, and uses of biblical manuscripts produced in Europe and the Mediterranean, continuing this tradition of study in its own way within the TDMAM research unit.

This colloquium will be an opportunity to recall the close scientific ties between Paul Kahle and Gérard Weil, and to pay tribute to the researchers who are still working today to better understand the mechanisms of material transmission of religious and sacred texts, and, as Philippe Cassuto – himself a fervent disciple of Gérard Weil – liked to say, to study the texts "as they are and not as they should be".
